MIAMI EAST LOCAL SCHOOLS BOARD BITS

Review of August 20, 2012 Regular Board Meeting

Kevin Accurso, board president, called the regular meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., held in room 116 in the Lecture Hall at Miami East High School. The country was honored by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call was taken with board members Kevin Accurso, Brad Burton, Gayle Carson, Mark Davis, and Rusty Miller in attendance.

Also in attendance were: Barb Minnich, staff member; and Melanie Yingst, Troy Daily Newspaper.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

There were no public comments heard.

GOOD NEWS RECOGNITION/INFORMATIONAL REPORTS:

- Beginning during the 2012-2013 school year the district will pilot a student laptop option at the high school. The district is very excited to begin piloting a program at the high school that will place twenty-five laptops throughout the high school that students will purchase and own.

This will be a voluntary program that will offer a laptop that would retail at over \$900 for approximately \$400. These laptops can be used both at school and the students will take them home to continue utilizing them for educational purposes. Students will utilize the benefits of the laptop while they are at Miami East and would then take ownership of the laptop when they graduate.

The pilot program will begin with 25 laptops. After the pilot period has concluded the district will review the program and look to expand the program to additional students.

The district would like to recognize and Thank One Call Now for their support in initiating the Kids Read Now Program across the county. Third Graders at Miami East were encouraged to participate in the program and we have heard numerous positive comments about the program.

Seed funding was provided, One Call Now, America's largest message notification service. The program for 2012 brought roughly 18,000 books to 2,500 students. The added technology delivered weekly calls and texts to families, motivating them to keep reading and allowing them to respond and track their reading time, as well as earn additional books.

D. 2012-2013 BUS STOP SCHEDULE:

<u>Gayle Carson</u> moved and <u>Mark Davis</u> seconded motion to approve the adoption of the following resolution "Be it resolved by the Board of Education of the Miami East Local School District, a majority of its full membership therein concurring, that it approve the bus stop schedules for the 2012-2013 school year, attached hereto and incorporated herein

by reference as Exhibit A and that it grant authority to the administration to modify these schedules, if needed, throughout the year."

OTHER INFORMATIONAL/DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- The First Staff Day was held on August 20, beginning at 7:30 a.m. in the high school cafeteria. The first staff day was highlighted by visits from Mike Rindler, Piqua Fire Chief and the Miami East Education Foundation (MEEF).

Fire Chief Rindler presented a program focusing on the importance of fire drills and being proactive both at school and in your own home with regard to fire safety. The program was very powerful and emphasized how much time a person has to escape a fire before it is too late.

Myrna Yoder and Beth Culbertson were present to award this year's school personnel grants. Last spring MEEF awarded \$5,000 in senior student scholarships and this morning MEEF award \$3,000 in school personnel grants. The district would like to thank MEEF and all of its supporters for its continued support of the students and district at Miami East.

- Miami East FFA Washington Leadership Conference letter.
- Dr. Rappold shared information regarding this year's implementation of the Third Grade Reading Guarantee.

The Third Grade Reading Guarantee is designed to ensure that all Ohio's students are reading at grade level by the end of third grade. Students must receive diagnostic assessments so that those who are not on track for reading at grade level can get the extra time and help they need to overcome their reading deficiencies.

Some key points from the new requirement include:

- a. All K-3 students will undergo annual diagnostic tests to determine reading ability;
- b. If a student is not on track to read at grade level, the school district must create a reading improvement and monitoring plan that details the student's reading deficiencies, describes needed interventions and includes parents in the improvement plan;
- c. Unless students are exempted for reasons stated in law, those who have not reached grade-level reading by the end of the third grade will be retained. Students who are retained will continue to receive intensive remediation, including at least 90 minutes of reading instruction daily; and
- d. These provisions take effect this fall, but student retention under the new criteria will not occur until the 2013-14 school year.
