Thursday and Friday, May 3 and 4, members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter attended the Ohio FFA State Convention in Columbus. Members were recognized for various accomplishments and competed in several contests. While in Columbus, the members the convention's Career Show, met FFA members from across the state, and enjoyed eating out.

Motivation speakers at the convention included Professional Motivational Speakers Gian Paul Gonzalez, former Ohio State and NFL football player Eddie George, USDA Under Secretary Greg Ilbach, National FFA Secretary Erica Baier and State FFA President Ryan Matthews.

During the National Chapter Award results the chapter was named a Top 10 Chapter, out of over 320 chapters in the state. Additionally, the chapter placed in the Top 10 in the areas of Growing Leaders, Building Communities, and Strengthening Agriculture. These results are from the chapter's National Chapter Application. The application will now be sent to the National FFA for review and placing. Additionally, the chapter was recognized for being a Gold Medal Chapter. FFA Holds Annual Parent-Member Banquet

The Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter recently held its 59th Annual Parent Member Banquet. Over 300 parents, members, and guests were attendance at Miami East High School Gymnasium. Highlights of the evening were:

the practice sites. The Dairy Cattle Team practiced at Quietcove Holstein Farm in Wapakoneta, Knoop Holstein Farm in Fletcher, Hershberger Jersey Farm in Troy, Hines Holstein Farm in Chickasaw, and Buschur Dairy Farm in New Weston.

On March 3 at the Marysville/Champaign County Invitational in Marysville the Dairy Cattle Team placed 16th and consisted of Michael Bair, Chloee Thomas and Elizabeth Bair. Michael Bair was the highest placing individual from Miami East at 34th out of 101 contestants.

On March 10 at the Miami Trace FFA Invitational in Washington Court House the Dairy Cattle Team placed 13th and consisted of Michael Bair, Ethin Bendickson and Elizabeth Bair. Michael Bair was the highest placing individual from Miami East at 26 out of 93 contestants.

The State Dairy Cattle Evaluation Career Development Event was held on April 7 at Ohio State-ATI in Wooster. The team placed 16 out of 57 teams. The highest individual from Miami East was Ethin Bendickson placing 33 out of 295 contestants. Michael Bair placed 46.

Plant and Animal Science Students Go Wild

Students from the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter had the tables turned for a day when they became teachers at Miami East Elementary School on Friday, April 20. 23 second-year students enrolled in Plant and Animal Sciences were trained in Project WILD earlier in April and then prepared 20 minute lessons to educate Kindergarten, first graders, and second graders about wildlife and wildlife habitats.

The goal of Project WILD is to assist learners of any age in developing the awareness, knowledge, skills, and commitment to result in informed decisions, responsible behavior, and constructive actions concerning wildlife and the environment upon which all life depends. Linda Raterman of the Miami County Soil and Water Conservation District was responsible for the training and lesson development the FFA members went through.

Ethin Bendickson, Kearsten Kirby, Kelsea Drake, Michael Bair, Saige Lacey, and Kyle Baker played "Animal Charades" to teach about domesticated and wild animals with Mrs. Jennifer McCuistion, and Mrs. Lauren Nosker classes.

"Quick Frozen Critters" was a fast, freeze tag game to help learn about predators and prey. Elizabeth Bair, Josie Desautels and Anastasia Kilbourne really enjoyed teaching this game with Mrs. Carmen Richter's class.

Austin Ferryman, Brailyn Tarcea, and Savannah Holzen played the "Thicket Game" with Mr. Preston Elifritz's class. The game included a hind-and-go-seek game to mimic how wild animals hide from their predators.

Luke Gilliland and Megan Honeyman shared a game



called "How Many Bears Can Live In This Forest?" In this activity Mrs. Amanda Riley's class learned about the carrying capacity of bear habitats.

In the game Color Crazy, Chloee Thomas, Blake Snyder, Daniel

Baker, Madison Calvert and Blaine Brokschmidt taught Mrs. Ashley Demmitt and Mrs. Betsey Seger's class about an animal's ability to adapt to their environment through camouflage.

According to Raterman, Project WILD is endorsed by the Ohio Department of Education (Divisions of Curriculum and Instruction and Professional Development), Ohio Department of Natural Resources and Ohio Wildlife Federation, League of Ohio Sportsmen.

Trees Given to Fourth Grade Students

FFA members realize that farmers and ranchers provide food and habitat for 75 percent of the nation's wildlife. Not only will the trees provide cover for wildlife in the area, they will also produce quality oxygen.

All students were challenged to plant their tree in celebration of Earthy Day. Earth Day is an annual event, celebrated on Sunday, April 22, on which events are held worldwide to demonstrate support for environmental protection. It was first celebrated in 1970, and is now coordinated globally by the Earth Day Network and celebrated in more than 192 countries each year.
