FFA Members Compete at State FFA Convention

Thursday and Friday, April 29 and 30 members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter participated in the Ohio FFA Virtual State Convention. Members were recognized for various accomplishments and competed in several contests.

Motivation speakers at the convention included the National FFA Vice President Artha Jonassaint and State FFA President Bethany Starlin. Serving as voting delegates were Isaac Beal and Adi Richter with the assistance of Luke Brunke.

The highlight of the event was the conferring of the State FFA Degree. This year, Miami East High School had five members receive such an honor. Seniors Erin Baker, Sarah Blocher, Carter Gilbert, Jimmy Sutherly, and Seth Wells earned the degree. The degree requirements are based on their earned income from their Supervised Agricultural Experience program, leadership experience, and FFA and community activities.



During the National Chapter Award results the chapter placed in the Top 10 in the area of Building Communities and was named a Gold Medal Chapter. These results are from the chapter's National Chapter



Application. The application will now be sent to the National FFA for review and placing. Members sharing informational presentations were Carter Gilbert and Lauren Wright.

Students were recognized for having outstanding Supervised Agricultural Experience Programs through the State Proficiency Award program. All Additionally, in proficiency awards Emma Sutherly was named second in the area Goat Production.

FFA Meats Evaluation Team Finishes Judging Season

On Tuesday, April 27, the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter Meats Evaluation Team competed in the Ohio FFA State Virtual Career Development Event. Team members were Emma Sutherly, Dottie Everett, Braden Zekas, Samuel Sutherly, Isaac Beal, Jillian Niswonger and Thomas Wallace. The team placed 6 out of 43 teams. The highest placing individual from Miami East was Emma Sutherly whom placed 18 out of 205 individuals.

During the event, contestants were asked to quality and yield grade beef carcasses, place and answer questions on carcasses, wholesale and retail cuts, and identify various retail cuts. Additionally, contestants completed a knowledge test and meats formulation solution challenge.

Previously, the team had competed in several virtual meats competitions. At the Champaign County Invitational where they were fourth and Emma Sutherly was the highest placing individual from Miami East.

During the Ohio State Buckeye Invitational the team placed fifth. The highest placing individual from Miami East was Braden Zekas.

ME Elementary Goes WILD

Students from the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter had the tables turned for a day when they became teachers at Miami East Elementary School on Monday, April 13. 24 second-year students enrolled in Plant and Animal Sciences were trained in Project WILD earlier in April and then prepared 20 minute lessons to educate second and third graders about wildlife and wildlife habitats.

The goal of Project WILD is to assist learners of



any age in developing the awareness, knowledge, skills, and commitment to result in informed decisions,

responsible behavior, and constructive actions concerning wildlife and the environment upon which all life depends.

Ms. Linda Raterman of the Miami County Soil and Water Conservation District was responsible for the training and lesson development the FFA members went through. In 2021 all training was completed virtually.

One group played "Animal Charades" to teach about domesticated and wild animals. Dustin Winner, Isaac Beal, and Spencer Triplett worked with Mrs. Elizabeth
