

Corn Contest Proves Big Ears Means Big Yields

Recently, members from the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter were challenged to participate in the annual Chapter Corn Contest. The rules of the contest were to bring in one ear of corn and earn a cornrelated prize. All participants got a can of soda pop because corn syrup is a major ingredient. Overall



winners were presented an FFA sweatshirt from the FFA Chapter.

A winner is chosen based on the predicted yield of the corn. The grand prize

winner was determined by the highest yield estimate, based on plant population per acre. Agriculture Education students in Plant and Animal Sciences took time in class to figure the predicted yield of corn ears as part of their continuing education of agronomy.

The overall winner was Paige Pence. Her corn was predicted to yield 308 bushels to the acre with a 35,000 seed population per acre. Her corn was a DeKalb product. Second place went to Samuel Sutherly who presented an ear of corn that is predicted to produce 303.6 bushels per acre with a 34,500 seed population per acre. His was an AgriGold product. Third place went to Lauren Wright with an ear of corn predicted to yield 290 bushels to the acre with a 32,000 seed population per acre. Hers was an AgriGold product.

On Wednesday, September 26, members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter competed in the District 5 Soils Judging Contest in Miami County at the Lost Creek Reserve and Knoop Agricultural Heritage Center owned by the Miami County Parks District.

The Urban Soils team consisted of Zach Kronenberger, Rylee Puthoff, Carter Gilbert, Emma Sutherly,



and Jarrett Winner.
The team placed 2 out of 28 teams. Zach
Kronenberger was the highest placing individual from
Miami East placing 4 out of 162 individuals.
Additional close

placers were Rylee Puthoff at 10, Carter Gilbert at 12, Emma Sutherly at 18, and Jarrett Winner at 21.

The contest consisted of evaluating three soils pit for slope, erosion, drainage, depth, and soil texture. Also, the

contestants took a written test and answered questions from the soil survey.

Previously, the teams had competed at the Miami County Soils Career Development Event coordinated by the Miami Soil and Water Conservation District. Participants included Carter Gilbert, Haley Horne, Sierra Johnson, Zach Kronenberger, Evan Massie, Rylee Puthoff, Kris Richey, Cael Rose, Emma Sutherly, Sam Sutherly, and Jarrett Winner.

Both the Urban and Rural Teams will now advance to the State Soils Career Development event in October. The site of the event will be in central Ohio.

Seatbelt Awareness Activity Held

On Friday, September 21, as part of National Farm Safety and Health Awareness Week, the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter held a Seatbelt Awareness Activity. As students exited the parking lot at Miami East High School, the drivers were stopped and their seatbelts were checked.

All student drivers were inspected for wearing their seatbelt. They received a handful of "Life Saver" candies and reminded that, "Seatbelts are Life Savers." Any student drivers or passengers not wearing their seatbelts were



instructed to put on their seatbelt immediately.

Results of the event proved that a majority of the drivers at Miami East High School do wear their seatbelt. Over 40 drivers and

passengers were presented candy with 4.9% of drivers were not wearing their seatbelt. Similar results as were collected last spring when 3.8% of drivers were not wearing their seatbelt.

The first seatbelt was in a Volvo vehicle in 1849. On February 15, 1885, the seatbelt patent was given to Edward J. Claghorn. By the 1930s doctors were requesting the vehicles be equipped with the restraining device. By the 1950s they were seen regularly in automobiles. And legislation in 1966-1968 made them mandatory for all cars.

The FFA's Safety Committee would like to encourage all drivers to slowdown and wear their seatbelt. Committee members involved in this activity were Elizabeth Bair, Daniel Baker, Tyler Heckman Lane Mergler, Cody Niswonger, and Brailyn Tarcea.

FFA Recognized by National FFA

The National FFA Organization recently announced the results of the National FFA Evaluations. Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter was selected as a Top 10 in the nation in the area of Growing Leaders. The chapter was bestowed the honor because of the seven Little Free Libraries the chapter organized and placed throughout the school district. Now, two students will prepare and present a 15 minute presentation on the benefits of the book exchange program.

Additionally, the chapter was named a 3-Star National Chapter for the National FFA Chapter Award Program. A 3-star is the highest award a chapter can be recognized for in the National Chapter process. In order to be considered for such an honor, the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter had to place in the top 10% in the state of Ohio. In May, the chapter learned that they were in the Top 10 in the state and would have their application forwarded to national evaluations.

This is the 18th straight year that the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter will be recognized at the National FFA Convention in their National Chapter Award program. Two students will receive the plaque on stage during the National FFA Convention, October 25 in Indianapolis, Indiana.

The FFA's National Chapter Award program recognized FFA chapters for developing and conducting a detailed Program of Activities (POA). These activities and projects provide opportunities for members to achieve in the areas of growing leaders, building communities, and strengthening agriculture divisions. Every year, chapters are recognized as having earned a

one-, two-, or three-star rating on their National Chapter application.

Furthermore, Mr. Les Kinder, Miami East FFA Alumni President, will receive the Honorary American FFA Degree. Individuals who have provided exceptional service on a national level to agriculture, agricultural education, or FFA are eligible for the Honorary American FFA Degree. Mr. Kinder will be recognized on stage at the National FFA Convention on October 26.
