FFA Member Places at State



On Saturday, March 7, Emma Sutherly competed in the State FFA Public Speaking Contest held at Marysville High School. Emma is a sophomore and second year member of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter.

Emma competed in the Beginning Prepared Public Speaking Career Development

Event and placed 4th overall in the state competition. She

advanced to the state contest after placing first at the county and second at the district contests earlier in February.

Emma's speech was entitled, "Could Chevon Save the World's Food Supply?" Emma's speech addressed the possibility of goat meat to fit the growing food security needs of the an increasing population. Her speech was 5-7 minutes in length and answered questions related to her speech.

State FFA Evaluations Held

The State FFA Evaluations were recently held at the Ohio FFA Center in Columbus, Ohio. Several members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter competed in various competitions. Members became eligible for State Evaluations by placing at District Evaluations in February.

State FFA Degrees – Juniors Natalie Bair, Adam Bensman, Makayla Brittain, Libby Carpenter, Paige Pence, Rylee Puthoff, Lauren Wright and senior Elizabeth Bair submitted applications to receive the State FFA Degree. Their applications were approved, and they will receive their Degrees in May at the State FFA Convention in Columbus.



American FFA Degrees – Graduates Liza Bair, Kylie Blair, and Zach Kronenberger applied to receive the American FFA Degree. Their applications were reviewed and will now be submitted to the National FFA Organization. If approved by National FFA they will receive their degree at the National FFA Convention in October.

Proficiency Awards – Members applied for a district and state proficiency award. They were recognized for having an outstanding Supervised Agricultural Experience program in one of 47 areas. Four members applied placed in the state and will receive an interview. They just received notice of interviews for being Top 4 in the State candidates. They will now prepare a display of their project, be interviewed by an industry panel of judges, and be recognized on stage at the State FFA Convention.

Beef Production Placement – Lucas Gilliland has job placement at Stone Springs Shorthorns in Casstown. He works with the production of beef animals, feeds livestock, and assists with other farm production practices.

Dairy Production Placement – Michael Bair works on his family's organic dairy farm. He assists in milking cows and caring for calves following organically raised farm practices. He attended rotational grazing clinics and mixes feed.

Diversified Livestock Production – Michael Bair has job placement on his family's dairy and poultry farm. He is responsible for milking cows, feed and caring for livestock, and gathering eggs to be sold. He also raises and markets his own market chickens.

Poultry Production – Michael Bair raises and markets "Michael's Pasture Raised Poultry" through his on-farm sales and a local virtual market. He earned a National FFA Grant to purchase a freezer to store his product in. He also works for his family's organic egg sales.

Vegetable Production – Lauren Wright owns and operates Wright's Sweet Corn, a 1 acre sweet corn patch. She markets her sweet corn through a roadside stand and at the Troy Farmers Market.

Agricultural Power Diagnostics Team Competes

Chapter Competes in County and District Public Speaking Career Development Events

The District 5 FFA Public Speaking Career



Development Event was held Wednesday, February 12, hosted by Memorial High School in Saint Marys. FFA Chapters competing

in the District Event were from Auglaize, Darke, Mercer, Miami, Montgomery, Preble, and Shelby counties. FFA members competing in the FFA Creed Speaking Event memorized and recited the FFA Creed and answered questions on their interpretation of the FFA Creed. This contest is open to first year FFA members only. Representing Miami East-MVCTC was Isaac Beal. Beal places fifth.

Emma Sutherly competed in the Beginning Prepared Speaking Event. She wrote and presented a five to seven minute speech then answered questions. Her speech topic was the important of goat meat to feeding the world's growing population. Sutherly placed second, received a plaque from the District 5 FFA Chapters, and advanced to the State FFA Speaking Event in March.

The Extemporaneous Speaking Event members are given an agriculture topic then have 30 minutes to prepare a 4 to 6 minute speech and follow-up answer questions. Representing Miami East-MVCTC was Evan Massie. He placed eighth.

Recently several members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter competed in the District 5 FFA Agricultural Sales Career Development Event hosted by Preble Shawnee High School.

prepared a team sales presentation, and demonstrated their ability to sell an agricultural product.

Braden Zekas was the highest placing individual from Miami East. The team placed ninth out of 15 teams.

Three Local FFA members receive \$1,000 grants from National FFA Foundation

Three \$1,000 grants have been awarded to Miami East-MVCTC FFA members Emma Sutherly, Samuel Sutherly, and Lauren Wright by the National FFA Organization. The SAE Grant is designed to help FFA members create and enhance their Supervised Agricultural Experience (SAE), a requirement that all FFA members must complete.

All three are members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter and were selected as recipients of only 149



grants out of over 2,100 applicants nationwide.

An SAE requires FFA members to create and operate an agriculture-related business, work at an agriculture-related business or conduct

an agricultural research experience. Upon completion of the grant fiscal year, grant recipients must submit a comprehensive report regarding their career development experience.

Emma Sutherly is the daughter of Sam and Laura Sutherly. She received a \$1,000 grant from Domino's via the National FFA Foundation. Sutherly will use the grant funds to purchase goat kidding pens to be used in her ownership and the operating a goat production operation with her twin. She markets her goat's offspring through social media and annual production sale.

Samuel Sutherly received a grant from Rabo AgriFinance via the National FFA Foundation. Samuel is the son of Sam and Laura Sutherly. He received a \$1,000 SAE Grant to purchase goat kidding pens to be used during the birthing season and viewing of prospect kids in his goat production operation. He owns the business in partnership

with his twin and markets via social media and an annual production sale.

Lauren Wright is the daughter of Eric and Jill Wright. She received a \$1,000 grant from Domino's via the National FFA Foundation. Wright owns Wright's Sweet Corn in which she raised almost an acre of sweet corn that she marketed through social media, a self-serve stand, and at local farmers markets. She will use her grant monies to purchase a system to protect her sweet corn from predators such as raccoons and deer.
