Members Attend National FFA Convention

The 95th National FFA Convention is the largest event hosted by the National FFA. 20 members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA chapter were in attendance at the convention in Indianapolis, Indiana. Over 65,000 members, parents, and guests were in attendance at the National FFA Convention. Previous conventions were held in Kansas City, Missouri and Louisville, Kentucky.

Convention activities included attending several convention sessions where members were inspired by motivational speakers such as the 2021-2022 National FFA Officers and four-time Olympic gold medalist and WNBA player Tamika Catchings. Attendees enjoyed attending the Lauren Alaina and Jimmie Allen concert, World's Toughest Rodeo, the FFA Shopping Mall and Career Show, and a tour of the Ozark Fishery and Crossroad Genetics Boar Stud. Miami East and Arcanum FFA members donated one elementary book at the National FFA Convention book drive.

The Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter received a Three-Star National Chapter Award, the highest award bestowed to an FFA Chapter. The chapter was selected for this honor based on its activities during the previous school year, in the areas of growing leaders, building communities, and strengthening agriculture.

Miami East Schools graduates Erin Baker, Adam Bensman, Makayla Brittain, Carter Gilbert, Paige Pence, Rylee Puthoff, Jimmy Sutherly, Seth Wells, Jarrett Winner, and Lauren Wright received the American FFA Degree. The American FFA Degree is the highest degree awarded by the National FFA Organization and recognizes members' ability to demonstrate leadership abilities and outstanding achievements in agricultural business, production, processing, and service programs. Recipients received gold American FFA Degree key and a certificate to commemorate the achievement.

Livestock Team Competes in Kansas City

Three members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter recently represented Ohio at the 123rd American Royal Livestock Judging Contest in Kansas City, Missouri. The team consisted of Rhylee Eichhorn, Wyatt Black, and Dustin Winner. The members were able to participate after placing third in the Ohio FFA Livestock Evaluation competition in the spring of 2022.

The focus of the American Royal Livestock Judging Contest was to develop the skills necessary to effectively evaluate beef, swine, sheep, and goats. During the contest the contestants judged 10 classes of livestock and gave 6 sets of oral reasons. The team placed 13th with Rhylee Eichhorn was the highest placing individual from Miami East.

While in the Kansas City area, the team visited and practiced judging at Kansas State University. They also had practices at the Brian Habjan Family Farm and with Ward Brothers Cattle. They made stops at Cavendar's Western Wear and Cabela's. Additionally, the

team ate at local restaurants such as Joe's Gas Station BBQ, the Hereford House, and Fritz's Railroad Café where the meal was delivered via a toy railroad train.



Prior trip preparations included practices at the Eichhorn Showpigs (Rhyan and Alisha Eichhorn), Lynn Allen Goat Farms (Brent and Christine Pence), and Fine Brothers Show Sheep (Bryan and Lindsey Fine). Additional support was given by the Miami Valley Career Technology Center and the Miami East FFA Alumni and Supporters.

During the Livestock Evaluation Career Development Event (CDE), members rank breeding and market classes of beef, sheep and swine and give oral reasons to back up their decisions. Members participating in this CDE make accurate and logical observations of livestock, decide on the desirable traits in marketing and breeding livestock, and select and market livestock that will satisfy consumer demands and provide increased economic returns to producers. Understanding what makes a good market or breeding beef, sheep or swine is valuable knowledge for the decisions every livestock producer has to make. This CDE also encourages students to communicate proficiently, interpret data and work as a team — skills that translate into other career opportunities.

Greenhands Attend State Conference

On Saturday, October 8, 8 Miami East-MVCTC FFA first-year members attended the 2022 State Greenhand Conference hosted by the Versailles FFA Chapter. The theme was "First Down and Life To Go," and the conference offered workshops for the first-year agricultural education students to learn about opportunities in the FFA, setting goals, developing communication skills, and working in teams. Additionally, attendees rotated through various Career Development Events that FFA members can get involved in during their FFA membership.

The keynote speakers were Dan and Charity Schroer with their message on the importance of making good decisions. Additional presenters for the conference included sessions by Ohio's National FFA Officer Candidate Branson Van Fleet and members of the 2022-23 Ohio FFA State FFA Officer team including Aubrey Schwartz, Graham Carson, Kennedy Short, Katie Oestreich, Dalton Mullins, Luke Jennings, Benjamin Bitner, Alyson Murphy, and Landon Shelpman. The participants enjoyed the opportunity to meet FFA members from across the state of Ohio and learn more about FFA. Almost 400 members were in attendance.

Corn Contest Yields Big Results

Recently, members from the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter were challenged to participate in the annual Chapter Corn Contest. The rules of the contest were to bring in one ear of corn and earn a prize. Winners were



presented an FFA T-shirt from the FFA Chapter.

A winner is chosen based on the predicted yield of the corn. The grand prize winner was determined by the highest yield

estimate, based on plant population per acre. Agricultural Education students in Plant and Animal Science classes took time in class to figure the predicted yield of corn ears as part of their continuing education of agronomy.

The overall winner was Keira Kirby. Her corn was predicted to yield 372.4 bushels to the acre with a 36,000 seed population per acre. Her corn was a Ebberts corn product. Second place went to Kaci Manns who presented an ear of corn that is predicted to produce 357.8 bushels per acre with a 35,000 seed population per acre. Hers was a DeKalb. Third place went to Matthew Osting

with an ear of corn predicted to yield 338.2 bushels to the acre with a 36,500 seed population per acre. His was a Seed Consultants product. Fourth place went to Jadyn Bair with a yield of 338 bushels to the acre with a seed population rate of 36,000 and was a Pioneer product. Jenna Taylor placed fifth with a predicted yield of 331.5 with a DeKalb product with a population rate of 35,000 kernels per acre. Rhylee Eichhorn had the longest ear at 10 inches.

As a whole, the contest yielded an average of 292.6 bushels per acre. This is 10 bushels to the acre higher than last year's results. Additional participants included Abby Maxson, Emma Hershberger, Connor Maxson, Jon Hart, Isabel Eichhorn, Wyatt Black, Madison Maxson, Fletcher Harris, and Trenton Griffith.

Members Compete in Soils Contests

On Wednesday, September 28, members of the



Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter competed in the District 5 Soils Judging Contest in Auglaize County in the New Bremen area.

The Urban

Soils team consisted of Rhylee Eichhorn, Luke Robinson, Kirya Wise, and Jaycee Roeth. The team placed 10 out of 19 teams. Rhylee Eichhorn was the highest placing individual from Miami East placing 22 out of 117





The Agriculture/Rural Soils team consisted of Wyatt Black, Connor Maxson, Kinsley Courtright, Emmitt Ondera, Kaci Manns, Brian

Fulton, Shelby Buck and Emily Zawalich. The team placed 13 out of 31 teams. Connor Maxson was the highest individual from Miami East placing 23 out 201 contestants.

The contest consisted of evaluating three soils pit for slope, erosion, drainage, depth, and soil texture and structure. Also, the contestants took a written test and answered questions from the soil survey.

Previously, the teams had competed at the Miami County Soils Career Development Event coordinated by the Miami Soil and Water Conservation District. Participants included Emmitt Ondera, Kaci Manns, Wyatt Black, Brian Fulton, and Kirya Wise.

Seatbelt Awareness Activity Held

On Tuesday, September 22, as part of National Farm Safety and Health Awareness Week, the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter held a Seatbelt Awareness Activity. As students exited the parking lot at Miami East High School, the drivers were stopped and their seatbelts

were checked.

All student drivers and passengers were inspected for wearing their seatbelt. They received a "Smarties" candy because seatbelts save

lives and drivers are smart to wear their seatbelt. Any student drivers or passengers not wearing their seatbelts were instructed to put on their seatbelt immediately.

Results of the event proved that a majority of the drivers at Miami East High School do wear their seatbelt. Over 50 drivers and passengers were presented candy with 96.3% of drivers were wearing their seatbelt and the remainder not wearing the seatbelt. Similar results as were collected last fall when 93.9% of drivers were wearing their seatbelt.

The first seatbelt was in a Volvo vehicle in 1849. On February 15, 1885, the seatbelt patent was given to Edward J. Claghorn. By the 1930s doctors were requesting the vehicles be equipped with the restraining device. By the 1950s they were seen regularly in automobiles. And legislation in 1966-1968 made them mandatory for all cars.

The FFA's Safety Committee would like to encourage all drivers to slowdown and wear their seatbelt. Committee members involved in this activity were Sydney Brittain, Ava Prince, and Braden Zekas.
