


Miami East Local Schools will hold a Homecoming Parade on Wednesday, October 12 at 6:30pm followed by the powder puff game at the stadium.



What is that building on the corner?

How many times have you and visitors driven by the building on the corner of State Route 589 and Troy Urbana and wondered what that building was? This building was the one-room Blaker School.

The Blaker School officially closed its doors as a one-room school house in 1918. Twenty students attended Blaker that final year. Blaker School was one of eight one-room school houses in the early 1900's.

In 1918 Freda Ford drove her horse and buggy from Loy Pike to the school each day to teach students in grades 1-8. Arriving before the students she would start the Coal stove and prepare for the day's lessons. "Miss Ford" taught reading, penmanship, math, geography, history, spelling, grammar, health, and music. Excited to be a teacher at Miami East, she earned \$50 per month. (Information from the Piqua Daily Call, September 8, 1973)

Corn Contest Proves Big Ears Means Big Yields

Recently, members from the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter were challenged to participate in the annual Chapter Corn Contest. The rules of the contest were to bring in one ear of corn and earn a prize. Winners were presented with an FFA T-shirt from the FFA Chapter.

A winner is chosen based on the predicted yield of the corn. The grand prize winner was determined by the highest yield estimate, based on plant population per acre. Agricultural Education students in Plant and Animal Science classes took time in class to figure the predicted yield of corn ears as part of their continuing education of crop sciences production.

The overall winner was Keira Kirby. Her corn was predicted to yield 372.4 bushels to the acre with a 36,000 seed population per acre. Her corn was an Ebberts corn product. Second place went to Kaci Manns who presented an ear of corn that is predicted to produce 357.8 bushels per acre with a 35,000 seed population per acre. Hers was a DeKalb. Third place went to Matthew Osting with an ear of corn predicted to yield 338.2 bushels to the acre with a 36,500 seed population per acre. His was a Seed Consultants product. Fourth place went to Jadyn Bair with a yield of 338 bushels to the acre with a seed population rate of 36,000 and was a Pioneer product. Jenna Taylor placed fifth with a predicted yield of 331.5 with a DeKalb product with a population rate of 35,000 kernels per acre. Rhylee Eichhorn had the longest ear at 10 inches.

As a whole, the contest yielded an average of 292.6 bushels per acre. This is 10 bushels to the acre higher than last year's results. Additional participants included Abby Maxson, Emma Hershberger, Connor Maxson, Jon Hart, Isabel Eichhorn, Wyatt Black, Madison Maxson, Fletcher Harris, and Trenton Griffith.



District Soils Contest Held

On Wednesday, September 28, members of the Miami East-MVCTC FFA Chapter competed in the District 5 Soils Judging Contest in Auglaize County in the New Bremen area.


The Urban Soils team consisted of Rhylee Eichhorn, Luke Robinson, Kirya Wise, and Jaycee Roeth. The team placed 10 out of 19 teams. Rhylee Eichhorn was the highest placing individual from Miami East placing 22 out of 117 individuals.

The Agriculture/Rural Soils team consisted of Wyatt Black, Connor Maxson, Kinsley Courtright, Emmitt Ondera, Kaci Manns, Brian Fulton, Shelby Buck and Emily Zawalich. The team placed 13 out of 31 teams. Connor Maxson was the highest individual from Miami East placing 23 out 201 contestants.

The contest consisted of evaluating three soils pit for slope, erosion, drainage, depth, and soil texture and structure. Also, the contestants took a written test and answered questions from the soil survey.

Previously, the teams had competed at the Miami County Soils Career Development Event coordinated by the Miami Soil and Water Conservation District. Participants included Emmitt Ondera, Kaci Manns, Wyatt Black, Brian Fulton, and Kirya Wise.



CDC Relaxed COVID Guidelines

9-11-2022

The following are the relaxed 2022 COVID guidelines for Miami East. Please keep in mind, mandates could change requiring the district to make adjustments.

STUDENTS AND STAFF WHO TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

Students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 must continue to follow isolation guidelines and may not attend school or related activities.

On Aug. 11, the CDC updated guidance on COVID-19, what actions to take if exposed to COVID-19, and what actions to take if you have symptoms or test positive with the virus.

The CDC relaxed its COVID-19 guidelines, dropping the recommendation that Americans quarantine themselves if they come into close contact with an infected person.

As a result, ODH is updating its guidance for Ohio K-12 schools and recommending the CDC's general guidance to best protect Ohio's students in the school setting.

- First, because contact tracing and case investigation has shifted to focus on high-risk environments, such as long-term care facilities and healthcare settings, **ODH** is no longer recommending the Mask to Stay, Test to Play quarantine alternative for schools.
- Instead, ODH recommends schools follow general isolation procedures from the CDC for confirmed cases.

If students or staff feel sick or suspect they might have COVID-19, they should stay home and take a rapid test. If positive, students and staff should stay home from school for at least 5 days and longer if necessary until fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and symptoms are improving.

Additionally, after isolation ends, students and staff should continue to take precautions as they resume normal activities by wearing a mask for 5 days (or after two negative tests 48 hours apart).

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention also said people no longer need to stay at least 6 feet away from others.

The CDC previously said that if people who are not up to date on their COVID-19 vaccinations come into close contact with a person who tests positive, they should stay home for at least five days.

Now the agency says quarantining at home is not necessary, but it urges those people to wear a high-quality mask for 10 days and get tested after five.

The agency continues to say that people who test positive should isolate from others for at least five days, regardless of whether they were vaccinated.

CDC officials advise that people can end isolation if they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of medication and they are without symptoms or the symptoms are improving.
